The Tunnel

Written by Sarah Howden • Illustrated by Erika Rodriguez Medina

After something bad happens, a boy feels sad and gray. Mom and Aunt Cheryl try to talk about it, but he feels like running away. So he picks up a shovel and starts digging a tunnel from his room, deep down and into the backyard. Out there, far from the lights of the house, it's dark enough that he could disappear. But the quiet distance also gives him the space he needs to see his family's love and start returning home.

Heading back, the journey upward is different. He notices familiar details and tunes in to his senses. The tunnel isn't so scary this time. The boy emerges into his room just as Mom peeks in. When she notices a twig in his hair, he is ready to talk about the tunnel and finds warmth in her gentle acknowledgment: "You came back."

Quiet, emotionally resonant text is paired with grayscale drawings accented with red in this thoughtfully layered exploration of coping with tough emotions, and taking time and space to heal.

SARAH HOWDEN is the author of several books for children, including *5-Minute Stories for Fearless Girls* and *Cone Cat*. She lives in Toronto, Ontario, with her husband and daughter and their two rambunctious cats.

ERIKA RODRIGUEZ MEDINA is an art teacher and illustrator currently living and working in Vancouver, British Columbia. Comfortable with both traditional and digital media, she prefers organic shapes and natural-looking textures, which will find their way into everything she makes. A Park Connects Us

Written by Sarah Nelson • Illustrated by Ellen Rooney

This picture book excursion through a city park invites readers to discover how shared green spaces bring us together. Lyrical, upbeat text illuminates the abundant gifts the park offers. Vibrant mixed-media illustrations show a diverse group of visitors as they explore this communal space. Children frolic; couples wander; flowers bloom and birds zoom; friends and families picnic and play ball or simply sink their toes peacefully into the present moment. Meanwhile, rolling hills and green trees enfold visitors in nature's beauty. Encouraged by the sense of unity the park creates, the visitors come together for a joyful dance party and a march for peace and equality. Spread by spread, we see how urban parks are for everyone—whatever we are.

This love letter to public parks depicts an inclusive and accessible space where community flourishes. Without a screen in sight, it gently hints at the adventures to be had offline and encourages readers to venture into nature and connect with their neighborhoods. Back matter provides a brief history of urban parks in North America and highlights park successes around the world.

SARAH NELSON is a poet and teacher, and the author of several books for young children, including *Frogness* and the *I Like the Weather* series. Sarah's stories and poems explore a variety of themes, but she especially loves writing about nature and often spots book ideas in the parks around her Minnesota home as they hop, honk, or pedal past.

ELLEN ROONEY is a collage artist and picture book illustrator. Originally from the state of Massachusetts, she now lives in the southern Okanagan Valley in British Columbia with her husband and dog.






Dinosaur Dance-off

exuberance that celebrates all things pink, one surly cat stands apart and teaches the kids a gentle lesson about choosing what you love, no matter who you are, while respecting the unique preferences of everybody around you.


This uplifting ode to self-expression goes beyond the binary expectations of gender to emphasize the importance of creativity and acceptance. It invites readers into a welcoming space where different clothing, toys, and colors are enjoyed by all. With a diverse cast of kids and inclusive, gender-neutral language, this book encourages children to embrace their true colors.

One whirligig's journey reveals the delights of the natural world




Whirl

A stray whirligig, or maple key, is picked up by the wind and begins a long, wordless journey through a local neighborhood. It twirls and flips through a family's backyard. It slips beneath skateboard wheels and sneakers in the park. It falls into the hands of a few curious kids, who include it in their games and artwork. Eventually, the whirligig finds a place to rest. With the help of a nosy bird and a tender puppy paw, it is dropped into a forest and firmly planted in the ground. Years later, a family that encountered the whirligig on its journey takes a walk in the forest and meets the seed again—this time as a fully grown maple tree!

This gentle meditation on the cycle of life wordlessly draws connections between humans and nature. The dynamic and detailed artwork supports visual literacy and will spark discussion about plant life cycles. And the whirligig's journey on the wind may encourage readers to venture into green spaces and observe them with care and curiosity.



DEBORAH KERBEL is an award-winning author who writes picture books, books for middle-grade readers, and YA novels. Her recent works include *Fred & Marjorie*, *This House Is Home*, and *When Molly Drew Dogs*. Deborah lives and writes in Thornhill, Ontario, with her husband, two teens, and a rescue schnoodle named Freddie.

JOSÉE BISAILLON has illustrated more than forty picture books, three of which have been nominated for a Governor General's Literary Award. 





My Delicious Garden



is time for sowing the seeds in eggshells, and April gives way to the first leaves of her seedlings.



The Great Bird Circus is headed to a big show, but they run into trouble when they reach the border. Paloma and the ringmaster are allowed to cross—but their birds need paperwork, and lots of it! The situation seems hopeless, unless ... what if there's more than one way to get across?

With Paloma's quick and creative thinking, the troupe is able to outwit the bureaucracy and come up with a solution: they free the birds from their cages, and while Paloma and the ringmaster drive across the border in their truck, the birds fly overhead! When the circus is reunited on the other side, Paloma suggests the birds don't need cages—they can fly free.

Minimal text, light humor, and loose illustrations work together to express big ideas simply in this uplifting story that prizes problem-solving and creative thinking.



BARROUX lives in Paris, France, and has studied photography, art, sculpture, and architecture. He is well known for his own children's books, as well as for the many books he has illustrated (more than 100!), including *Sometimes a Wall*. Barroux believes that the world needs fewer borders and more birds, fewer politicians and more poets.

Birds can do a lot more than just fly! Did you know some of them can dig, dance, dive, and dabble? This non-fiction book introduces readers to an assortment of fascinating birds and their surprising behaviors. Readers will learn about flightless birds like the Adélie penguin, which toboggans down hills on its belly, or the kakapo, which climbs up trees to escape danger. Even birds that fly have quirky survival behaviors—like the barred owl, which can turn its head almost all the way around, or the blue-footed booby, which dives from great heights to catch fish.

Written by prolific children’s non-fiction author and educator Etta Kaner and whimsically illustrated by artist June Steube, *Dig, Dance, Dive* invites readers to greet all sorts of amazing feathered friends in a fun and informative exploration.

ETTA KANER writes for both children and educators. Many of her books have won awards such as the Silver Birch Award, the Henry Bergh Award, the Animal Behavior Society Award, the Science Writers and Communicators of Canada Award, the *Scientific American* Young Readers Book Award, and the Science in Society Book Award.
