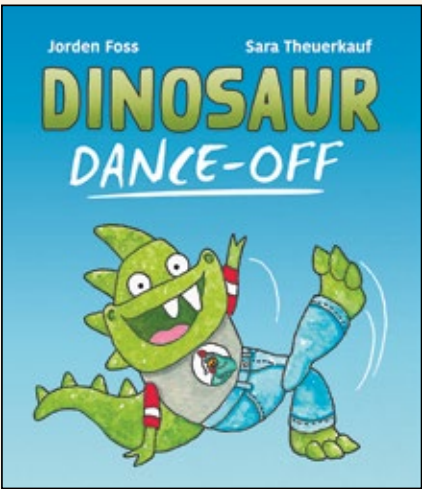

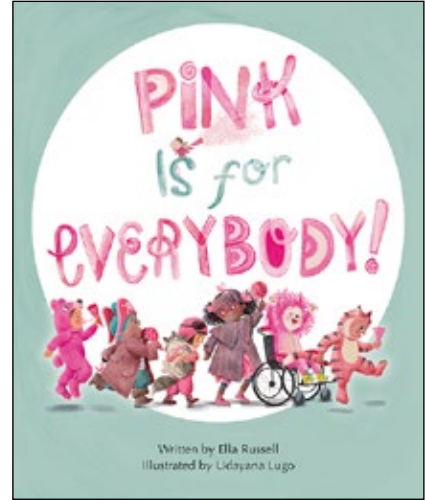

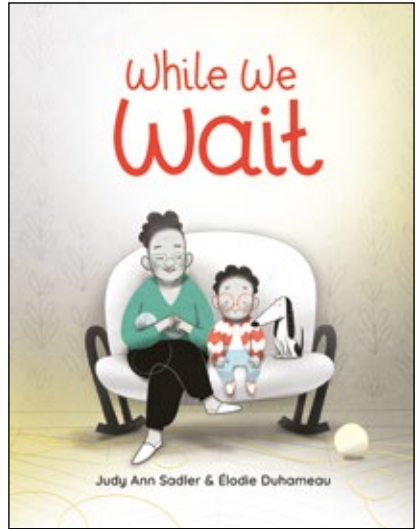
Pink Is for Everybody

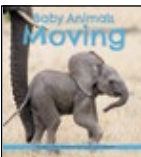
