





Step I: Create your Rat


What you need

- · Clay (for body)
- Paper or card (for ears)
- Sticks or pipe cleaners or paper (for arms)
- Bead or small rock (for nose)
- Toothpick or skewer or pencil to poke small holes (for eyes)



Directions

- 1. Roll a piece of clay in the size and shape of a small avocado.
- 2. Make another smaller egg-shaped ball for the head.
- 3. Make two small ovals of clay for the feet.
- 4. Make arms from sticks, paper, pipe cleaners or clay.
- 5. Cut two pointed ovals for ears out of paper or card, and push them into the head section of the clay.
- 6. Use the toothpick or pencil to poke small holes in the clay to make the eyes. You can also use this to carve the mouth shape.





Your rat needs a squirrel-ish tail. In Squirrel-ish, Rat gets creative and crafts SIX different tails! Let's make FOUR tails for your rat.






Step 2: Make the perfect tails for your rat

Directions

Prototype I. Puffy tail: Glue or tape cotton balls, pompoms or balls of tissue paper to a popsicle stick.
