

#### Reflection—Text-to-Self

- In "The Stone", Otis and Peanut miss Pearl. What do you do when you miss someone?
- In "The Visit", Marion comes to visit. Has someone special, a friend or a family member, come to visit you? How did you feel? What did you do together?
